Ohioans currently eligible to receive vaccines can schedule their appointment:

- Online at gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov; enter ZIP code 44115 in the search field.
- By phone by calling 1-833-4-ASK-ODH (1-833-427-5634).
- State and federal employees will be visiting certain communities to offer in-person registration.

What to bring: Many [forms of ID](#) are accepted to verify your name, identity, and age. You do not need to show proof of citizenship or residency status.

Cost: No cost, insurance not required.

Parking: Free.

Transportation assistance: Call United Way 211 for transportation assistance, with options including a free Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA) bus pass, ride-share services, and rides through Senior Transportation Connect and local churches.

Talking Points

Mass Vaccination Site

- All the available COVID-19 vaccines have been proven safe and effective at preventing serious illness, hospitalization, and death from COVID-19.
- There is no cost to get a COVID-19 vaccine, even if you don't have insurance.
- Many forms of ID are accepted, and you do not need to provide proof of citizenship or residency to be eligible. Providers will need to verify your name, identity, and age.
- Make an appointment to get your COVID-19 vaccine at Cleveland State's Wolstein Center at online at gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov or by phone at 1-833-4-ASK-ODH (1-833-427-5634). When booking online, enter ZIP code 44115 in the search field to find the Wolstein Center location.
- Beginning March 17, appointments are available seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- Transportation assistance is available. Call 211 for transportation assistance, with options including a free Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA) bus pass, ride-share services, and rides through Senior Transportation Connect and local churches.
- Parking is free.

COVID-19 Vaccines

- **All COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective.** COVID-19 vaccines currently available in the U.S. were rigorously tested and proven effective at preventing serious illness, hospitalization, and death from COVID-19 disease. The COVID-19 vaccine development process included several steps comparable with those used to develop earlier vaccines, such as the flu or chickenpox vaccine. The FDA and independent medical experts have ensured that these vaccines are thoroughly and rigorously evaluated.
- **No corners have been cut.** In addition to decades of research and groundwork, COVID-19 vaccines were able to be developed more quickly thanks to a strategic effort to streamline processes and cut "red tape."
- **You can't get COVID-19 from a COVID-19 vaccine.** The vaccines do not contain a live virus, meaning they can't give you COVID-19 or cause a positive COVID-19 viral test.
- **COVID-19 vaccine studies were among the largest in history.** A typical vaccine study has about 5,000 participants. The Moderna COVID-19 clinical trial had about 30,000 participants, and the Johnson & Johnson and Pfizer-BioNTech trials had about 43,000 each.
- **COVID-19 vaccines have not been linked to infertility or miscarriage.** There is no evidence that COVID-19 vaccines cause infertility or increase the risk of miscarriage.
- **COVID-19 vaccines will not change your DNA or alter your genetic makeup.** None of the COVID-19 vaccines alter or modify a person's genetic makeup. They all teach the body how to protect against future infection.
- **Vaccine injections do NOT contain microchips or tracking devices.** Vaccines do not contain microchips, nanochips, RFID trackers, or devices that would track or control your body in any way.

- **Side effects are mild, and are normal signs that your body is building protection.** Similar to side effects from other vaccines, like a flu shot, they should go away in a few days. Some people have reported experiencing soreness or redness at the site of the injection, body aches, headaches or fever, lasting for a day or two. Severe reactions, or anaphylaxes, are rare. If you have allergies — especially severe ones that include allergies to other vaccines or ingredients in the vaccines — discuss the COVID-19 vaccine with your doctor, who can assess your risk and provide more information about if and how you can get vaccinated safely. Ohio, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) are monitoring the distribution and any negative reactions to the vaccine.
- **There is no out-of-pocket cost for you to get a COVID-19 vaccine.** Your provider may ask for your insurance, Medicare, or Medicaid information, because providers can charge an administration fee to insurance. You will not have to pay a fee directly.
- **Clinical trials that studied the vaccines' effectiveness and safety included a diverse cross-section of people,** including communities that have historically been under-represented in clinical research. The clinical studies included participants:
 - From communities of color (42% of Pfizer-BioNTech's participants, 37% of the Moderna participants, 35% of Johnson & Johnson participants).
 - Older than age 65 (21% of Pfizer-BioNTech participants; 23% of Moderna participants); older than 60 (34% of Johnson & Johnson participants).
 - With high-risk chronic diseases that put them at increased risk of severe COVID-19, such as diabetes, severe obesity, and cardiac disease (46% of Pfizer-BioNTech participants; 42% of Moderna participants, 40% of Johnson & Johnson participants).

No-cost vaccines

There is no cost to get a COVID-19 vaccine, even if you don't have insurance. Your provider may ask for your insurance, Medicare, or Medicaid information, because providers can charge an administration fee to insurance. You will not have to pay a fee directly. Parking is free.

Transportation assistance

Call 211 to receive a free Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA) bus pass or funding for a ride-share service. Other forms of transportation will also be provided, including transportation through Senior Transportation Connect and local churches.

Will I have to come back for a second dose?

The vaccines available at the Wolstein Center require two doses, spaced three weeks apart.


